

Code of Conduct for B.C. Crane Operators

The Code of Conduct sets out the expectations for the professional and ethical conduct of crane operators in

B.C. Certified operators and those in the process of becoming certified by BC Crane Safety must follow the key principles and standards set out in the Code.

Key Principles and Standards of the Code

As a crane operator, you must do the following:

- Ensure the health and safety of people and the protection of property when you are on the job. Follow the laws, regulations, and safe work practices that apply to crane operations in B.C.
- Report any dangers or unacceptable risks to people or property to employers, clients, employees, the public, and appropriate authorities.
- Make no false statements about your certification or your certification card.
- Only perform work for which you are certified as competent by BC Crane Safety. Make sure that all certificates you hold are valid.
- Immediately inform BC Crane Safety of matters that affect your ability to operate a crane safely. Failure to do so may result in disciplinary action.
- Keep current with your skills and knowledge. You can do this by taking part in ongoing professional development.
- Promote respectful workplaces and practices.



- Follow the requirements of the certification program. Don't share BC Crane Safety exam materials or information about them. Don't cheat on exams or take part in any other fraudulent test-taking practices.
- Surrender your BC Crane Safety wallet card if you are suspended or your certification is withdrawn.
- Promptly report violations of this Code of Conduct to BC Crane Safety.

Crane operators who are accused of violating this Code of Conduct will be subject to review by the Assessment Review Panel. The Panel carries out reviews according to principles of fair and due process.
